

Prepositions

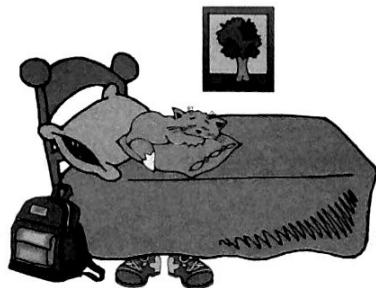
Prepositions tell you where or when something happens. → Rob went to Scotland on Tuesday.
