We will watch films about Wolves - National Geographic, Spy Wolf.



My body and Me

We will be learning about animals including humans. We will learn that living things can be classified into different groups - fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals and that they can be carnivores, herbivores and omnivores. We will discover that healthy human bodies have two arms, two hands, two feet, two legs, a head, chest and stomach. We will learn that we taste with the tongue, see with our eyes, smell with our nose, hear with pour eyes and feel with our hands and fingers and that humans and other animals need water, food and air to survive.

Number | Year 1

Place value – recognising tens and ones within a given number, comparing and ordering numbers

Addition and subtraction-finding the difference, comparing numbers.

Number | Year 2

Place value – recognising hundreds, tens and ones within a given number, comparing and ordering numbers. Addition and subtraction -calculating using 1- and 2-digit numbers crossing ten and not crossing ten.

Position and Direction | Year 1

Describing movements and turns including left right forward backwards

Position and Direction Year 2

Describing movements and turns using the vocabulary left, right, forwards backwards. half, full and three-quarter turns, clockwise and anticlockwise.
